Summer Membership Meeting July 26, 2015

The 106th meeting of the Hancock Historical Society was held on Sunday, July 26, 2015 at Town Hall with President Dan Murphy presiding.

A light crowd of 15 friends were in attendance, including two guests from St. Mary's County.

Minutes from the previous membership meeting were read by Secretary / Treasurer Wayne Keefer and approved as written.

President Murphy reported that the Hancock Historical Society is likely not to participate in the Washington County Museum Ramble. He cited our participation last year over a two day period which brought in only one person, the event organizer.

It was reported that work continues on a design and layout of the old Hancock Post Office structure to be placed in the Museum.

Museum hours are to be changed, due to the difficulty in finding volunteers to staff the location. The museum will now be opened on the first Sunday, April – October, from 2-4pm. A new sign will be ordered, and announcements will be made. Previous hours were the second and fourth Sunday.

Vice President Marian Golden reported on the progress of the Bowls House. During the first two months of May and June, over 900 visitors came. Another 70 came over the most recent weekend. The Bowles House Visitor Center will be open only until Labor Day as per the original agreement with the US Parks Service, but if the remainder of the summer continues to be successful, VP Golden may try to renegotiate for mid-October. VP Golden also reported that the US Parks Service has been wonderful to work with on the project.

Guest Speakers – Mac Elser, and travelers from St. Mary's County to Hancock

Hancock Historical Society Board Member Mac Elser gave a wonderful presentation, to include a slideshow of pictures, on early settlers from St. Mary's County coming into Hancock. His presentation included maps of differing routes that would have been taken, and present day photographs of some locations. Two guests were in attendance from St. Mary's County who had heard about the lecture just prior to the meeting.

Special Mention – The passing of Odell H. Rosen

Odell H. Rosen, age 96, a long-time supporter of Hancock and the Hancock Historical Society, passed away on August 10, 2015 at his home in North Carolina. Born January 30, 1919, he held various appointed government posts on both the local, state, and national front, including an appointment by US President Lyndon Johnson to the US Committee on Equal Employment Opportunity. Perhaps in Hancock, he is best known for operating Rosen's Downtown, a clothing retailer with locations in Hancock, Hagerstown, Carlisle, Martinsburg, and Charles Town. Upon his passing, he bequeathed the sum of \$2,500 and a special photograph to the Historical Society. His wife, Pearl, passed away in 2009.
